## Word Families Based on Common Words

This week, we are again looking at spellings that belong to the same family of words. Knowing that a word follows a particular pattern can make it simpler to spell.

Many words share the same **origin** or root word.

The word 'origin' means where something came from or where it began.



The particular root word that we are going to look at this week is...



which derives from Latin and is often associated with words that mean **to mark or to seal**.


