What does it mean having two Year 5 classes?



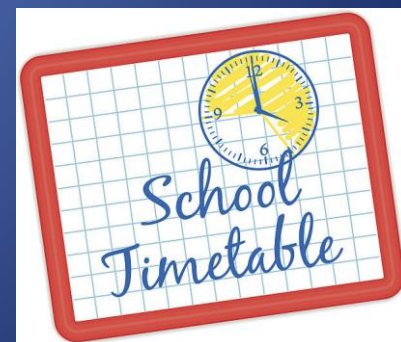
Now that we have expanded to a two form entry school, we have a Blue and Yellow class for each year group. Both classes in each year group will have the same timetable and will be taught the same curriculum.

How will my child be taught?

All Year 5 pupils will be taught by the Year 5 team of teachers. This will allow us to maximise learning opportunities for the children and play to teachers' subject specialisms.

How will my child be assessed?

We continually assess children both before and after their learning. We share their next steps and targets with them with both verbal and written feedback. Reading, Maths and Writing assessments will take place throughout the year and we will inform you of your child's attainment at Parents Evenings.



What can we look forward to in Year 5?



Year 5 is usually an incredibly busy year with lots of exciting activities and experiences.

Already we have planned a Anglo-Saxon workshop to launch our History topic in Spring term, Christmas Carol Service and a Christmas Panto. We hope to take the children on a second trip.

The children will be working with clay this year during their Art Lessons. In addition, they will have the opportunity to make Bread, sew a phone case and build an electronic car for their Design Technology Projects.

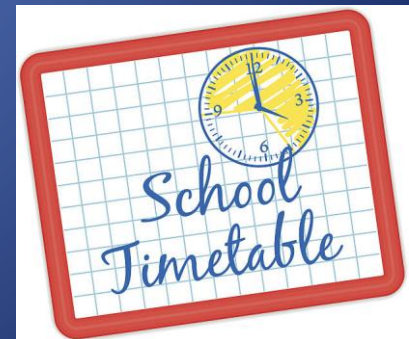
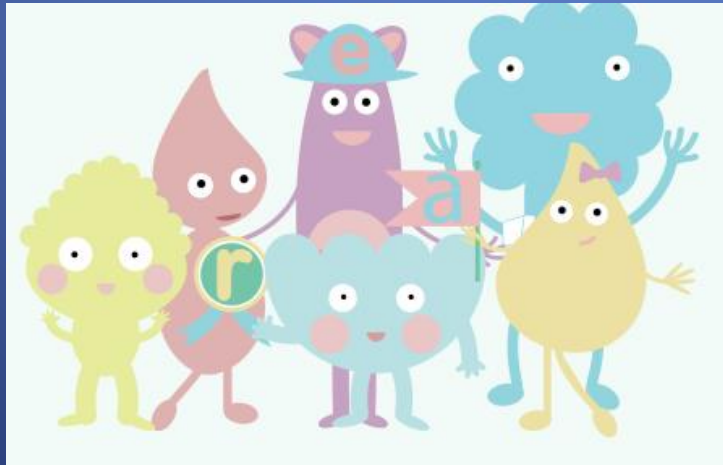

My Happy Mind



This year the children will be continuing to use a programme called My Happy Mind. This is a scheme to promote positive emotional well-being.

It's taught to every single child and there's a curriculum for every year group from Early Years to Year 6. There is also a staff wellbeing programme and a Parent App too!



How will my child be rewarded for their achievements and behaviour?



Behaviour Ladder

Each pupil has a name on our behaviour ladder. When they impress a member of staff, children may move their name up to two levels and receive a reward.

Class Marbles

In Year 5 we collect marbles as a class to receive a class reward. We need 20 marbles in each class to earn golden time or a class treat.

House points

There will be a focus for house points each half term. Children will be in the house they were in previous years.

UKS2 Department Award

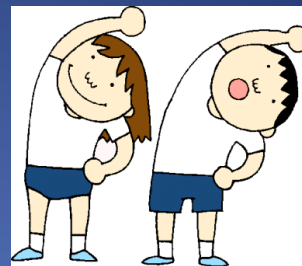
The focus for our department this half term is handwriting and presentation. Any child who impresses in this area will have their name displayed on the 'You've been spotted' celebration wall.

Reach for the Highest

One child each week will be nominated by their class teacher for the Reach for the Highest award. This can be any child that has proven to be trying their best in the learning or behaviour.



What do I need to remember in Year 5?



PE will be on a **Monday** and a **Wednesday** so children will need to come to school in their PE kits. A white t-shirt and navy shorts. Some PE will take place outside so ensure your child is wearing appropriate outdoor school PE kit. This consists of navy blue tracksuits bottoms, a white t-shirt and a navy hoody or tracksuit top. This should not be their school jumper. Pupils who repeatedly do not have the correct PE kit in Year 5 will be given lunchtime detentions.

The Daily Mile will take place on a **Thursday and Friday**. Children will need to bring trainers in on those days.

Your child will **NOT** need to bring a pencil case to school. They simply need to bring their water bottles and reading books everyday.

Long hair must be tied back. Please keep hair accessories to a minimum.

Headbands and bobbles must be discreet, small and school colours.

Pupils should not wear jewellery apart from a watch and simple stud earrings. Earrings should not be worn on PE day.

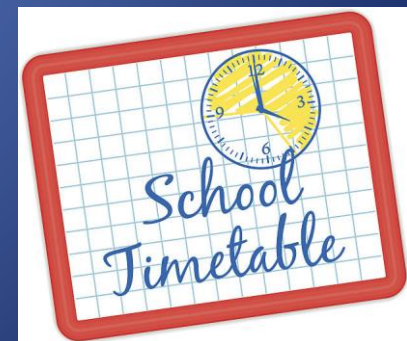
Inhalers need to be in date and in school.



What homework will my child receive this year?



Each week, your child will receive a combination of reading and arithmetic tasks to be completed in their reading journals. These tasks are designed to further develop their reading fluency whilst embedding their understanding of their English and Maths targets. Your child will be sent home a logins letter detailing their username and passwords for any websites they will need eg Times Table Rockstars. Try to keep this safe throughout the year.



How can I help my child at home?



The most important thing you can do with your child is to ensure they are reading regularly; at least 20 minutes, 5 times per week. Use their reading targets found in their reading journals to discuss their reading material at length. In Year 5, it is still important for your child to read aloud regularly to maintain fluency and expression.

It is important that we make Maths learning as fun and as relevant as possible. Please involve your child in everyday Maths such as baking, measuring, travel distances, changing money, time zones.

Essential skills when in Year 5:

Being able to tell the time to the nearest minute.

Knowing all the times tables up to $\times 12$ and corresponding division facts.

Write using a joined handwriting style.

Able to discuss authors and genres they enjoy in reading.

Able to recognise and use money (adding totals and calculating change mentally)

You may use the end of year expectations to carry out personal study and revision.
